

# Hunting Trip Planner Canada 2026

## Page 1: Licence, Season, Zone and Species

Use this before choosing dates or booking a hunt. Rules are provincial, species-specific, and zone-specific.

### Licence

Province or territory, resident status, hunter education, species tag, draw result, outfitter requirement.

### Season

Open dates, weapon/method season, legal shooting time, Sunday restrictions where relevant, youth or special seasons.

### Zone

Wildlife management unit, private land permission, access roads, park or conservation-area restrictions.

### Species

Legal sex/age class, bag limit, possession limit, evidence of sex, tagging and transport rules.

## Page 2: Safety, Access, Weather and Communication

A legal hunt can still become unsafe if weather, access, or communication planning is weak.

### Safety plan

Tell someone the route, return time, vehicle location, group names, and emergency contacts.

### Weather

Check wind, snow, rain, temperature swings, daylight, fire risk, road conditions, and lake/river crossings.

### Access

Confirm gates, permission, Crown land rules, parking, extraction routes, and alternate exits before dark.

### Communication

Carry charged phone, battery bank, offline maps, compass, whistle, and satellite device for remote country.

## Page 3: Gear, Reporting and Trip Review

Keep gear practical and record what happened so the next trip improves instead of repeating mistakes.

### Core gear

Layers, visibility clothing, first aid, headlamp, optics, navigation, water, food, fire starter, repair basics.

### Documents

Licence, tags, ID, firearm paperwork where required, land permission, vehicle notes, and source links.

### Reporting

Harvest report deadline, tag attachment, evidence rules, transport, meat care, and CWD or disease rules.

### Review

What worked, what failed, sightings, sign, wind, access, gear gaps, and what to change next time.
